S.B. No. 2323

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the functions of the Texas School Safety Center and 3 safety at public educational institutions. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 37.108, Education Code, is amended by 5 amending Subsections (a), (b), and (c) and adding Subsection (e) to 6 read as follows: 7 (a) Each school district or institution of higher education 8 shall adopt and implement a multihazard emergency operations plan 9 for use in the district's [district] schools or in the institution 10 of higher education. The plan must address mitigation, 11 12 preparedness, response, and recovery as defined by the commissioner of education or commissioner of higher education in conjunction 13 14 with the governor's office of homeland security. The plan must provide for: 15 (1) [district] employee training in responding to an 16 17 emergency; 18 (2) if the plan applies to a school district, mandatory school drills to prepare district students and employees 19 20 for responding to an emergency; 21 (3) measures to ensure coordination with local 22 management agencies, law enforcement, emergency and fire 23 departments in the event of an emergency; and 24 (4) the implementation of a security audit as required

1 by Subsection (b).

2 (b) At least once every <u>two</u> [three] years, a school district 3 <u>or institution of higher education</u> shall conduct a security audit 4 of the district's <u>or institution's</u> facilities. To the extent 5 possible, a district <u>or institution of higher education</u> shall 6 follow security audit procedures developed by the Texas School 7 Safety Center or a comparable public or private entity.

8 (c) A school district <u>or institution of higher education</u> 9 shall report the results of the security audit conducted under 10 Subsection (b) to the district's board of trustees <u>or the</u> 11 <u>institution's board of regents, as applicable,</u> and, in the manner 12 required by the Texas School Safety Center, to the Texas School 13 Safety Center.

14 (e) In this section, "institution of higher education" has 15 the meaning assigned by Section 61.003.

16 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 37, Education Code, is 17 amended by adding Section 37.109 to read as follows:

18 Sec. 37.109. SCHOOL SAFETY PLANNING COMMITTEE. (a) In 19 accordance with guidelines established by the Texas School Safety 20 Center, each campus in a school district shall establish a school 21 safety planning committee.

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(b) The committee shall:

(1) participate on behalf of the campus in developing and periodically updating the district multihazard emergency operations plan required by Section 37.108(a) to ensure that the plan reflects specific campus needs that are consistent with the plan;

No. 2323 1 (2) provide the district with any campus-level 2 information required in connection with a security audit required by Section 37.108(b), a security audit report required by Section 3 37.108(c), or another report required to be submitted by the 4 district to the Texas School Safety Center; and 5 6 (3) review each report required to be submitted by the 7 district to the Texas School Safety Center to ensure that the report 8 contains accurate and complete information regarding the campus, in accordance with criteria established by the center. 9 SECTION 3. Section 37.202, Education Code, is amended to 10 read as follows: 11 12 Sec. 37.202. PURPOSE. The purpose of the center is to serve 13 as: 14 (1)a central location for school safety information, including research, training, and technical assistance related to 15 successful school safety programs; 16 17 (2) a central registry of persons providing school safety consulting services in the state; and 18 19 (3) $\left[\frac{(2)}{(2)}\right]$ a resource for the prevention of youth violence and the promotion of safety in the state. 20 21 SECTION 4. Section 37.207(a), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 2.2 The center shall develop a model safety and security 23 (a) 24 audit procedure for use by school districts and institutions of higher education that includes: 25 26 (1) providing each district or institution with guidelines [and a training video] showing proper audit procedures; 27

reviewing each district or institution audit, 1 (2) providing the results of the review to the district or institution, 2 3 and making recommendations for improvements based on the audit; and 4 (3) incorporating the findings of district and 5 institution audits in a statewide report on school safety made available by the center to the public. 6 SECTION 5. Section 37.209, Education Code, is amended to 7 8 read as follows: 9 Sec. 37.209. CENTER WEBSITE. The center shall develop and maintain an interactive Internet website that includes: 10 quarterly news updates related to school safety 11 (1) and violence prevention; 12 school crime data; 13 (2) a schedule of training and special events; and 14 (3) 15 (4) a list of persons who [approved by the board to] provide school safety consulting services in this state and are 16 17 registered in accordance with Section 37.2091 [presentations]. SECTION 6. Subchapter G, Chapter 37, Education Code, is 18 amended by adding Sections 37.2091 and 37.2121 to read as follows: 19 Sec. 37.2091. REGISTRY OF PERSONS PROVIDING SCHOOL SAFETY 20 21 CONSULTING SERVICES. (a) The center shall establish a registry of persons providing school safety consulting services in this state. 22 (b) Each person providing school safety consulting services 23 24 in this state shall register with the center in accordance with requirements established by the center. The requirements must 25 26 include provisions requiring a person registering with the center to provide information regarding the person's background, 27

1 education, and experience that are relevant to the person's ability 2 to provide knowledgeable and effective school safety consulting 3 services. 4 (c) The registry is intended to serve only as an informational resource for school districts. The inclusion of a 5 person in the registry is not an indication that the center endorses 6 7 the person's qualifications or ability to provide school safety 8 consulting services. The center shall include information regarding the 9 (d) registry, including the number of persons registered and the 10

11 general degree of school safety experience possessed by those 12 persons, in the annual report required by Section 37.216.

Sec. 37.2121. MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING AND MUTUAL AID AGREEMENTS. (a) The center shall identify and inform school districts of the types of entities, including local and regional authorities, other school districts, and emergency first responders, with whom school districts should customarily make efforts to enter into memoranda of understanding or mutual aid agreements addressing issues that affect school safety.

20 <u>(b) The center shall develop guidelines regarding memoranda</u> 21 <u>of understanding and mutual aid agreements between school districts</u> 22 <u>and the entities identified in accordance with Subsection (a). The</u> 23 <u>guidelines:</u>

24 (1) must include descriptions of the provisions that 25 should customarily be included in each memorandum or agreement with 26 a particular type of entity; 27 (2) may include sample language for those provisions;

1	and
2	(3) must be consistent with the Texas Statewide Mutual
3	Aid System established under Subchapter E-1, Chapter 418,
4	Government Code.
5	(c) The center shall encourage school districts to enter
6	into memoranda of understanding and mutual aid agreements with
7	entities identified in accordance with Subsection (a) that comply
8	with the guidelines developed under Subsection (b).
9	(d) Each school district that enters into a memorandum of
10	understanding or mutual aid agreement addressing issues that affect
11	school safety shall provide a copy of the memorandum or agreement to
12	the center.
13	(e) The center shall include information regarding the
14	center's efforts under this section in the annual report required
15	by Section 37.216.
16	SECTION 7. Section 37.213, Education Code, is amended to
17	read as follows:
18	Sec. 37.213. INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. (a) In
19	this section, "institution of higher education" has the meaning
20	assigned by Section 61.003.
21	(b) The center, in cooperation with institutions of higher
22	education and the division of emergency management in the office of
23	the governor, shall coordinate the development of standards for
24	institutions of higher education in the following areas:
25	(1) emergency management plans;
26	(2) drills and exercises;
27	(3) risk assessment and hazard identification on a

1	campus-specific basis to determine appropriate campus information
2	for inclusion in emergency management plans; and
3	(4) required training for emergency management team
4	members.
5	(c) The center shall make standards developed under
6	Subsection (b) available to institutions of higher education
7	through a variety of readily accessible methods.
8	(d) The center shall provide institutions of higher
9	education with directed training, technical assistance, and
10	published guidelines to ensure understanding and implementation of
11	the standards developed under Subsection (b).
12	(e) The center shall research best practices regarding
13	emergency preparedness of institutions of higher education and
14	serve as a clearinghouse for that information.
15	(f) The center shall provide institutions of higher
16	education with training, technical assistance, and published
17	guidelines or templates, as appropriate, in the following areas:
18	(1) emergency management plan development;
19	(2) drill and exercise development and
20	<pre>implementation;</pre>
21	(3) mutual aid agreements;
22	(4) identification of equipment and funds that may be
23	used by institutions of higher education in an emergency; and
24	(5) reporting in accordance with 20 U.S.C. Section
25	<u>1092(f)</u> [An institution of higher education may use any appropriate
26	model plan developed by the center under Section 37.205(4).
27	[(c) The center may provide an institution of higher

1	education with on-site technical assistance and safety training.
2	[(d) The center may charge a fee to an institution of higher
3	education for assistance and training provided under Subsection
4	(c)].
5	SECTION 8. Subchapter G, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 37.2161 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 37.2161. SCHOOL SAFETY PROGRESS REPORT. (a) The
8	center shall periodically provide a school safety progress report
9	to the governor, the legislature, the State Board of Education, and
10	the agency that contains current information regarding school
11	safety in this state based on:
12	(1) each school district's multihazard emergency
13	operations plan required by Section 37.108(a);
14	(2) each school district's security audit required by
15	Section 37.108(b); and
16	(3) any other report required to be submitted to the
17	<u>center.</u>
18	(b) The center shall establish guidelines regarding the
19	specific information to be included in the report required by this
20	section.
21	(c) The center may provide the report required by this
22	section in conjunction with an annual report required by Section
23	37.216.
24	SECTION 9. Section 418.004(10), Government Code, is amended
25	to read as follows:
26	(10) "Local government entity" means a county,
27	incorporated city, independent school district, institution of

higher education, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code,
 emergency services district, other special district, joint board,
 or other entity defined as a political subdivision under the laws of
 this state that maintains the capability to provide mutual aid.
 SECTION 10. Section 37.210, Education Code, is repealed.

SECTION 11. A person providing school safety consulting
services in this state shall comply with Section 37.2091, Education
Code, as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2010.
SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
