## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the guaranteed benefits of a public school educator.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 21.0411 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 21.0411. DENIAL OF GUARANTEED BENEFITS. (a) It is a
7	violation of the educator's code of ethics adopted under Section
8	21.041 for a principal, supervisor, or administrator to deny an
9	educator a benefit provided to the educator under this chapter or
10	Chapter 22, including:
11	(1) planning and preparation time as provided by
12	Section 21.404;
13	(2) a duty-free lunch as provided by Section 21.405;
14	<u>and</u>
15	(3) personal leave as provided by Section 22.003.
16	(b) A principal, supervisor, or administrator may not
17	retaliate against an educator for asserting the educator's right to
18	a benefit under this chapter or Chapter 22. Actions that may be
19	considered retaliation under this subsection include:
20	(1) suspending or terminating the employment of the
21	educator; and
22	(2) taking other adverse personnel action against the
23	educator, including reassigning the educator or giving the educator

24 <u>a negative appraisal.</u>

- 1 (c) The board shall issue sanctions against a principal,
- 2 supervisor, or administrator who violates this section. Sanctions
- 3 may include:
- 4 (1) issuing a reprimand;
- 5 (2) placing a restriction on the certificate of the
- 6 principal, supervisor, or administrator;
- 7 (3) suspending the certificate of the principal,
- 8 supervisor, or administrator; or
- 9 (4) revoking or canceling the certificate of the
- 10 principal, supervisor, or administrator.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
- 12 school year.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
