## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 157, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 157.008 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 157.008. DELEGATION OF COSMETIC AND DERMATOLOGICAL
8	MEDICAL TREATMENTS. (a) In accordance with rules adopted by the
9	board, a physician may delegate to a qualified and properly trained
10	physician assistant:
11	(1) the administration of botulinum toxin injections;
12	(2) administration of dermal fillers;
13	(3) cosmetic or aesthetic medical treatments; or
14	(4) the use of a laser or intense pulsed light device
15	that is a prescription device under 21 C.F.R. 801.109 used for a
16	medical or dermatological treatment.
17	(b) The administration of a medical treatment or use of a
18	prescription device described under Subsection (a) is considered
19	the practice of medicine and may be performed only by a physician or
20	by a physician assistant under a physician's order, standing
21	medical order, standing delegation order, or protocol.
22	(c) The administration of a medical treatment or use of a
23	prescription device described under Subsection (a) must be in
24	compliance with laws relating to the practice of medicine and state

- 1 and federal laws relating to the administration of a medical
- 2 <u>treatment or use of a prescription device.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2010, the Texas Medical
- 4 Board shall adopt rules necessary to implement Section 157.008,
- 5 Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
