A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to annual reports by certain agencies conducting, funding,
3	or supporting biomedical research.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle H, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 172 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 172. BIOMEDICAL RESEARCH
8	Sec. 172.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "state agency"
9	means a department, commission, board, office, or other agency in
10	the executive branch of state government created by the state
11	constitution or a state statute, including an institution of higher
12	education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code.
13	Sec. 172.002. ANNUAL REPORT. (a) Not later than December
14	1 of each year, a state agency that conducts, funds, or supports
15	biomedical research shall submit to the governor, the Legislative
16	Budget Board, and the commissioner of state health services a
17	report, in the format established by the commissioner, on whether
18	the agency conducted, funded, or supported during the preceding
19	state fiscal year any research that involves human stem cells or
20	human cloning.
21	(b) A state agency that conducts, funds, or supports any
22	research that involves human stem cells or human cloning must
23	include in the report submitted under Subsection (a) information
24	on:

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1	(1) the type of research conducted, funded, or
2	supported by the state agency that involves:
3	(A) human stem cells; and
4	(B) human cloning, including therapeutic and
5	reproductive cloning;
6	(2) the process through which the human stem cells and
7	stem cell lines were derived, if applicable;
8	(3) the amount and source of state and federal money,
9	private grants, and other funding used to conduct, fund, or support
10	the research;
11	(4) the use of state facilities to conduct or support
12	the research; and
13	(5) the goals, progress, and results of the research.
14	(c) A state agency shall not include in the report:
15	(1) information that the agency is not required to
16	publicly disclose under Chapter 552, Government Code; or
17	(2) the name, address, or other personal identifying
18	information of an individual conducting or otherwise participating
19	in research that is the subject of the report.
20	SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2009, a state agency
21	that conducts, funds, or supports biomedical research shall submit
22	the initial report required under Chapter 172, Health and Safety
23	Code, as added by this Act.
24	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
25	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
