CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Extended families have long played an important role

2 in raising children when parents are unable or unwilling to do so;

3 and

WHEREAS, The 2000 U.S. Census found that across the country,

5 more than six million children were living in a household headed by

6 grandparents or other relatives; studies have found that such

7 kinship care provides numerous benefits; kinship placements tend to

8 be more permanent than foster care, and children gain a greater

9 sense of stability when they are loved and cared for in a familiar

10 setting by people they know and trust; kinship caregivers help

11 sustain extended family connections, continue lifelong traditions

12 and memories, and reinforce a child's sense of cultural identity

13 and self-esteem; and

WHEREAS, Although kinship placements bring many advantages,

15 the caregivers tend to be single, as well as older and less well off

16 than foster parents; in addition, kinship guardians today receive

17 fewer services for themselves and the children in their care; the

18 lack of financial resources and support services can lead to

19 difficulties that send children back into paid foster care;

20 accordingly, kinship programs have been developed across the nation

21 to help relatives cope with the responsibilities of child rearing

22 by providing assistance similar to that received by foster parents;

23 and

24 WHEREAS, The 80th Texas Legislature showed its support for

- 1 kinship caregivers in Rider 31 in Article II of House Bill 1
- 2 (Appropriations Act), which directed the Department of Family and
- 3 Protective Services to maximize federal funding for kinship
- 4 guardianship programs by developing and submitting or applying for
- 5 a waiver that would allow the State of Texas to use Title IV-E of the
- 6 Social Security Act or any other federal funds available for such
- 7 programs; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In October 2008, Congress enacted the Fostering
- 9 Connections to Success and Increasing Adoptions Act, which provides
- 10 federal resources to support kinship care; states are permitted to
- 11 claim federal reimbursement under Title IV-E for a part of the cost
- 12 of providing kinship guardianship assistance to every eligible
- 13 child who leaves foster care for placement with a grandparent or
- 14 other relative who has chosen to become the legal guardian; by
- 15 taking advantage of this funding, the State of Texas can help
- 16 kinship caregivers provide loving homes where children can thrive;
- 17 and
- WHEREAS, It is the intent of the legislature to take full
- 19 advantage of federal funds, including funds available for
- 20 subsidized guardianship programs for kinship caregivers as
- 21 provided by the Fostering Connections to Success and Increasing
- 22 Adoptions Act (P.L. 110-351); now, therefore, be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the 81st Legislature of the State of Texas
- 24 hereby direct the Health and Human Services Commission to seek
- 25 federal funds available under Title IV-E of the Social Security Act
- 26 and to pursue all available funding for the support of kinship
- 27 caregivers; and, be it further
