CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The year 2009 marks the 80th anniversary of the
- 2 death of railroad engineer Alonzo John Wemple, who spent much of his
- 3 career in Texas and died here in 1929; and
- WHEREAS, Alonzo Wemple was born in Schenectady, New York, on
- 5 October 1, 1833, and he spent his entire professional life as a
- 6 railroad man, working throughout the United States; during that
- 7 time, he was present at many significant historical events of that
- 8 era; and
- 9 WHEREAS, While working for the Illinois Central Railroad
- 10 during the Civil War, Engineer Wemple transported captured
- 11 Confederate soldiers to Union prison camps; and
- WHEREAS, In 1865, Mr. Wemple joined the elite group of
- 13 engineers who piloted the funeral train of President Abraham
- 14 Lincoln, which transported Lincoln's body, with stops for viewing,
- 15 from Washington, D.C., through Maryland, Pennsylvania, New York,
- 16 Ohio, and Indiana, to its final resting place in Springfield,
- 17 Illinois; working for the New York Central Railroad at the time, Mr.
- 18 Wemple piloted the train on part of its journey, probably from
- 19 Schenectady to Troy, New York, although it is possible he was the
- 20 engineer who brought the train into Springfield; and
- 21 WHEREAS, A few years later, Mr. Wemple was running a switch
- 22 engine in Illinois and witnessed the great Chicago fire that
- 23 ravaged the city in 1871; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Wemple then moved to Texas, and from 1886 to 1888

- 1 he piloted trains on the Texas and Pacific Railway that headed west
- 2 from Texarkana; he went on to settle in Bonham, where he piloted
- 3 switch engines for many years into the 1920s, and he died in Fort
- 4 Worth in 1929 at the age of 95; and
- 5 WHEREAS, History is made not only by the deeds of the famous
- 6 but also by the accumulated experience of countless individuals,
- 7 and although Alonzo Wemple played only a small part, he was a
- 8 witness to some of the most important events of his time; now,
- 9 therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the 81st Legislature of the State of Texas
- 11 hereby commemorate the life of Alonzo John Wemple and his role in
- 12 the history of this state and nation.
