A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment to replace the attorney
- 2 general on the legislative redistricting board with the

- 4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28, Article III, Texas Constitution, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 28. The Legislature shall, at its first regular
- 8 session after the publication of each United States decennial
- 9 census, apportion the state into senatorial and representative
- 10 districts, agreeable to the provisions of Sections 25 and 26 of this
- 11 Article. In the event the Legislature shall at any such first
- 12 regular session following the publication of a United States
- 13 decennial census, fail to make such apportionment, same shall be
- 14 done by the Legislative Redistricting Board of Texas, which is
- 15 hereby created, and shall be composed of five (5) members, as
- 16 follows: The Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House of
- 17 Representatives, the <u>Commissioner of Agriculture or other head of</u>
- 18 the executive department that oversees agriculture in this state
- 19 [Attorney General], the Comptroller of Public Accounts and the
- 20 Commissioner of the General Land Office, a majority of whom shall
- 21 constitute a quorum. Said Board shall assemble in the City of
- 22 Austin within ninety (90) days after the final adjournment of such
- 23 regular session. The Board shall, within sixty (60) days after
- 24 assembling, apportion the state into senatorial and representative

1 districts, or into senatorial or representative districts, as the failure of action of such Legislature may make necessary. Such 2 3 apportionment shall be in writing and signed by three (3) or more of the members of the Board duly acknowledged as the act and deed of 4 5 such Board, and, when so executed and filed with the Secretary of State, shall have force and effect of law. Such apportionment shall 6 become effective at the next succeeding statewide general election. 7 The Supreme Court of Texas shall have jurisdiction to compel such 8 Board to perform its duties in accordance with the provisions of 9 this section by writ of mandamus or other extraordinary writs 10 conformable to the usages of law. The Legislature shall provide 11 necessary funds for clerical and technical aid and for other 12 expenses incidental to the work of the Board, and the Lieutenant 13 14 Governor and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be 15 entitled to receive per diem and travel expense during the Board's session in the same manner and amount as they would receive while 16 17 attending a special session of the Legislature. SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be 18

SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 3, 2009.

The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment to replace the attorney general on the legislative redistricting board with the commissioner of agriculture."
