WHEREAS, Currently, area veterans in need of treatment for a special medical problem must travel in state to Lubbock, Waco, or San Antonio, or out of state to Albuquerque, New Mexico, or Arizona; many veterans do not have the means to make such trips and thus do not receive medical attention; and

WHEREAS, With Fort Bliss continuing to draw soldiers to the area and numerous veterans choosing to make El Paso and its environs their permanent home, a veterans' hospital in the city is an essential need; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the State of Texas, 81st Legislature, hereby support the establishment of a veterans' hospital in the city of El Paso; and, be it further
