Subchapter C, Chapter 552, Government Code, is 10 amended by adding Section 552.151 to read as follows: Sec. 552.151. EXCEPTION: INFORMATION REGARDING SELECT 11 AGENTS. (a) The following information that pertains to a 12 biological agent or toxin identified or listed as a select agent 13 14 under federal law, including under the Public Health Security and Bioterrorism Preparedness and Response Act of 2002 (Pub. L. No. 15 107-188) and regulations adopted under that Act, is excepted from 16 the requirements of Section 552.021: 17 18 (1) the specific location of a select agent within an 19 approved facility; (2) personal identifying information of an individual 20 21 whose name appears in documentation relating to the chain of custody of select agents, including a materials transfer agreement; 22 23 and 24 (3) the identity of an individual authorized to
