IN RE: HB161 by Deshotel (Relating to block grant funding for certain workforce training and employment programs and functions by the Texas Workforce Commission.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Labor Code relating to block grant funding for certain workforce training and employment programs and functions by the Texas Workforce Commission.
