IN RE: HB932 by Dutton (Relating to genetic testing in the determination of parentage and to a proceeding to vacate an order of paternity or child support.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend statute and permits a father to file a petition to vacate an order of paternity or child support under certain conditions. It is assumed that any additional costs associated with the implementation of the bill could be absorbed within existing state resources.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
