IN RE: HB950 by Dutton (Relating to the modification or enforcement of a child support order during the obligor's confinement in jail or prison.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Family Code provides that an order for the confinement of an obligor in a jail or prison is a material and substantial change of circumstances for purposes of modification of child support. The Office of the Attorney General anticipates any additional work resulting from the passage of this bill could be reasonably absorbed with current agency resources.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
