IN RE: HB1052 by Mallory Caraway (Relating to the creation, powers, and duties of film districts.), As Engrossed

### No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would authorize a municipality with a population of 250,000 or more to create a film district to promote the film industry in a designated area in the municipality. The bill stipulates the procedures for establishing a district, which would include holding a hearing prior to creating the district. The district would be required to have a board of directors, who would not receive compensation but would be entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses. The district would be authorized to accept a donation or grant, or to borrow money from any person for any district purpose. All or any part of the district would be eligible to be included in a tax increment reinvestment zone.

## Local Government Impact

A municipality would initially incur costs associated with holding a hearing; however, it is anticipated that those costs would not be significant. It is assumed that if a district is created, it would seek financial resources sufficient to meet the district's purposes.
