IN RE: HB1813 by Vo (Relating to the punishment for tampering with certain governmental records concerning forensic analyses.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Penal Code by making tampering with certain governmental records concerning forensic analyses punishable as a felony of the third degree. In the case of this bill, it is assumed that the number of offenders convicted under this statute would not result in a significant impact on the programs and workload of state corrections agencies or on the demand for resources and services of those agencies.
