IN RE: HB2748 by Chisum (Relating to the abolition of the Texas Environmental Education Partnership Fund.), As Engrossed

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would abolish the Texas Environmental Education Partnership Fund which was formerly comprised of a board appointed by the Governor. The board, which funding from the Supplemental Environmental Projects (SEP) program at the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to purchase and install air monitors. The TCEQ reports that the SEP project is closed and no longer active.
