IN RE: HB2909 by Marquez (Relating to allowing a governmental body to redact certain personal information under the public information law without the necessity of requesting a decision from the attorney general and the calculation of certain deadlines under the public information law.), **As Introduced**

<p>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</p>
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It is assumed a government entity would experience a minor savings in administrative costs related to not having to seek an opinion from the Office of Attorney General before redacting portions of requested information related to state employees, peace officers, family violence shelter personnel, or credit card or e-mail address information.

The bill would also amend the Government Code to further specify when a public record request is received by an agency.

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.
