**IN RE: HB4407** by Taylor (relating to rules concerning administration and maintenance of anaphylaxis medicine on public school campuses. ), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

This bill would require the Commissioner of Education to adopt rules relating to procedures, standing orders, and the supply of anaphylaxis medicine to be maintained at a school campus with a school nurse. The Texas Education Agency estimates that this cost would be absorbed within existing resources.

**Local Government Impact**

Costs for school districts to implement the bill's requirements concerning procedures, standing orders, and maintenance of a supply of anaphylaxis medicine at each campus with a school nurse could vary but are not expected to be significant on a statewide basis.
