IN RE: SB261 by Deuell (Relating to the taking of a specimen of the breath or blood of a person arrested for an intoxication offense under certain circumstances.), **As Engrossed**

The bill would amend the Transportation Code to add to the circumstances under which a peace officer would be authorized to take a specimen of a person's breath or blood.
