IN RE: SB776 by Averitt (Relating to regulating the collection or solicitation of donated goods subsequently sold by for-profit entities or individuals; providing a civil penalty.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Business and Commerce Code and regulate the collection or solicitation of donated goods subsequently sold by for-profit entities or individuals. It is assumed that any additional costs associated with implementation of the bill could be absorbed with current appropriations.
