**IN RE: SB1409** by Shapleigh (Relating to the definition of first responder for purposes of the immunization registry.), **As Introduced**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

This bill would expand the definition of first responders, for the purposes of immunization registry, to include public health, National Guard, Texas State Guard, hospital emergency, public safety, and related personnel. The agency assumes that the increase in the number of immunization records and immunization-related education would have a minimal cost which could be absorbed within existing federal-funding sources.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
