**IN RE: SB1415** by Hegar (Relating to the creation of a pilot program on deferred disciplinary action.), **As Introduced** 

#### No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would require the Texas Board of Nursing to determine the feasibility of conducting a pilot program designed to evaluate the efficacy of board deferral of disciplinary action against a licensee. If the board determines the pilot program is feasible, the board shall develop and implement the pilot program no later than February 1, 2011 and conclude the program by January 1, 2014. The bill would require the Board of Nursing to appoint an advisory committee to assist the board in overseeing the pilot program.

The Texas Board of Nursing indicates that any costs associated with the bill could be absorbed within the agency's existing resources.

#### **Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
