H.B. No. 2480

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1

2 relating to agreements with public junior colleges for courses for
3 joint high school and junior college credit.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 130.008, Education Code, is amended by
6 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

7 (d) A public junior college may enter into an agreement with
8 a school district, organization, or other person that operates a
9 high school to offer a course as provided by this section regardless
10 of whether the high school is located within the service area of the
11 junior college district.

12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
16 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

1 Amend H.B. No. 2480 (senate committee report) in SECTION 1
2 of the bill as follows:

3 (1) In the introductory language (page 1, line 12), strike
4 "Subsection (d)" and substitute "Subsections (d) and (d-1)".

5 (2) In added Section 130.008(d), Education Code (page 1,
6 line 13), strike "A public junior college" and substitute
7 "Except as provided by Subsection (d-1), a public junior
8 college".

9 (3) Immediately following added Section 130.008(d),
10 Education Code (page 1, between lines 17 and 18), insert the
11 following:

12 (d-1) A public junior college may enter into an agreement
13 described by Subsection (d) with respect to a high school
14 located within the service area of another junior college
15 district only if the other junior college district is unable to
16 provide the requested course to the satisfaction of the school
17 district.
