15 (b) A school district grievance policy must permit that an

16 audio recording may be made of any meeting or proceeding at which

the substance of a grievance that complies with the policy is 17

investigated or discussed. The recording may be made by a district 18

19 employee present at the meeting or proceeding or by the person

conducting the meeting or proceeding. If a recording is made, each 20

district employee or other person present at the meeting or 21

proceeding must be informed before the recording begins that the 22

23 recording will occur.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009. 24
