Based on the creation of the employment website that does not currently exist including an increased information resources workload, this analysis estimates TCLEOSE would need one additional Program Specialist FTE under the B10 salary group at \$49,296 per year for a total of \$63,380(including benefit costs of \$14,084) in fiscal years 2010 and 2011.

TCLEOSE includes technology costs estimated for the creation and maintenance of the website totaling \$353,895 in 2010 and \$69,724 in 2011 through 2014 for annual website operating costs.
