BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 821.001(5), Government Code, is amended
to read as follows:
(5) "Board of trustees" means the <u>persons</u> [board]
appointed or elected under this subtitle to administer the
retirement system.
SECTION 2. The heading to Section 825.002, Government Code,
is amended to read as follows:
Sec. 825.002. APPOINTMENT AND ELECTION OF TRUSTEES
[APPOINTED BY GOVERNOR].
SECTION 3. Sections 825.002(a), (c), (d), (e), (f), and
(g), Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
(a) The governor shall appoint, with the advice and consent

of the senate and as provided by Subsection (b) [this section],

- 18 (f) The board of trustees shall adopt rules for the election
- 19 of trustees [Persons considered for nomination] under Subsections
- 20 [Subsection] (c), (d), and [or] (e) [must have been nominated by
- 21 written ballot at an election conducted under rules adopted by the
- 22 board of trustees].
- 23 (g) To provide for the <u>election</u> [nomination of persons for
- 24 appointment] under Subsection (d), the board shall send to each
- 25 retiree of the retirement system:
- 26 (1) notice of the deadline for filing as a candidate
- 27 for election [nomination];

- 3 (3) a written ballot.
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 825.003, Government Code, is amended to

- 6 Sec. 825.003. TRUSTEES APPOINTED BY GOVERNOR FROM NOMINEES
- 7 OF BOARD OF EDUCATION. The governor shall appoint one member [two
- 8 members] of the board of trustees, subject to confirmation by
- 9 two-thirds of the senate, from lists of nominees submitted by the
- 10 State Board of Education. The member appointed under this
- 11 <u>subsection</u> [These members] must be <u>a person</u> [persons] who has
- 12 [have] demonstrated financial expertise, has [have] worked in
- 13 private business or industry, and has [have] broad investment
- 14 experience, preferably in investment of pension funds.
- SECTION 5. Sections 825.0032(a) and (b), Government Code,
- 16 are amended to read as follows:
- 17 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a person is not
- 18 eligible for appointment or election to the board of trustees if the
- 19 person or the person's spouse:
- 20 (1) is employed by or participates in the management
- 21 of a business entity or other organization receiving funds from the
- 22 retirement system;
- 23 (2) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more
- 24 than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other
- 25 organization receiving funds from the retirement system; or
- 26 (3) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible
- 27 goods, services, or funds from the retirement system, other than

- 1 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for board of
- 2 <u>trustees</u> membership, attendance, or expenses.
- 3 (b) Subsection (a) does not apply to employment by,
- 4 participation in the management of, or ownership or control of an
- 5 interest in a business entity or other organization on behalf of the
- 6 retirement system. Subsection (a)(3) does not apply to a person who
- 7 is <u>elected</u> [nominated for appointment] under Section 825.002(c),
- 8 (d), or (e).
- 9 SECTION 6. Sections 825.0041(a) and (c), Government Code,
- 10 are amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) A person who is appointed or elected to and qualifies
- 12 for office as a member of the board of trustees may not vote,
- 13 deliberate, or be counted as a member in attendance at a meeting of
- 14 the board until the person completes a training program that
- 15 complies with this section.
- 16 (c) A person appointed or elected to the board of trustees
- 17 is entitled to reimbursement under Section 825.007 for the travel
- 18 expenses incurred in attending the training program regardless of
- 19 whether the attendance at the program occurs before or after
- 20 the person qualifies for office.
- 21 SECTION 7. Section 825.009(a), Government Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 (a) A trustee <u>elected</u> [appointed from a slate of members
- 24 nominated] by members of the retirement system under Section
- 25 825.002 is entitled to leave with pay from the trustee's public
- 26 school employer to attend to the official business of the
- 27 retirement system.

- 12 the trustee's duties for a substantial part of the term for which
- 13 the trustee is appointed or elected; or
- 14 (5) is absent from more than half of the regularly
- 15 scheduled board meetings that the person is eligible to attend
- 16 during a calendar year without an excuse approved by a majority vote
- 17 of the board.
- 18 (c) If the executive director has knowledge that a potential
- 19 ground for removal exists, the executive director shall notify the
- 20 presiding officer of the board of trustees of the ground. The
- 21 presiding officer shall then notify the governor [appropriate
- 22 appointing officer] and the attorney general that a potential
- 23 ground for removal exists. If the potential ground for removal
- 24 involves the presiding officer, the executive director shall notify
- 25 the next highest officer of the board, who shall notify the governor
- 26 [appropriate appointing officer] and the attorney general that a
- 27 potential ground for removal exists.

- 2 election of a trustee of the board of trustees of the Teacher
- 3 Retirement System of Texas that occurs on or after the effective
- 4 date of this Act.
- 5 (b) A person who is serving as a trustee immediately before
- 6 the effective date of this Act may complete the trustee's term of
- 7 office, and the trustee's qualifications for serving as a trustee
- 8 are governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective
- 9 date of this Act until the date that trustee's term expires.
- 10 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
