2 relating to the date by which the executive director of the Texas
3 Department of Licensing and Regulation must require compliance with
4 certain elevator safety standards.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 754.014(f), Health and Safety Code, is
7 amended to read as follows:

8 (f) The executive director shall grant a delay until
9 September 1, 2015 [~~2010~~], for compliance with the requirements for
10 door restrictors or firefighter's service in the ASME Code A17.3 if
11 those requirements were not included in the ASME Code A17.1 that was
12 in effect on the date of installation and the equipment was not
13 subsequently installed. This subsection expires October 1, 2015.

14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
18 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

1 Amend C.S.H.B. No. 3628 (senate committee printing) by
2 striking SECTION 1 of the bill, amending Section 754.014(f), Health
3 and Safety Code (page 1, lines 14 through 21), and substituting the
4 following:

5 SECTION 1. Section 754.014, Health and Safety Code, is
6 amended by amending Subsection (f) and adding Subsection (f-1) to
7 read as follows:

8 (f) The executive director shall grant a delay until
9 September 1, 2012 [~~2010~~], for compliance with the requirements for
10 [~~door restrictors or~~] firefighter's service in the ASME Code A17.3
11 if those requirements were not included in the ASME Code A17.1 that
12 was in effect on the date of installation and the equipment was not
13 subsequently installed. This subsection expires October 1, 2012.

14 (f-1) The executive director shall grant a delay until
15 September 1, 2010, for compliance with the requirements for door
16 restrictors in the ASME Code A17.3. This subsection expires
17 October 1, 2010.
