H.B. No. 4114

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the Committee on House Administration and Senate
3 Committee on Administration directing the placement of a Tejano
4 memorial monument on the Capitol grounds.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Chapter 443, Government Code, is amended by
7 adding Section 443.01525 to read as follows:

8 Sec. 443.01525. TEJANO MEMORIAL MONUMENT. The Committee on
9 House Administration and the Senate Committee on Administration
10 shall direct the State Preservation Board to place the Tejano
11 memorial monument established by House Concurrent Resolution 38 of
12 the 77th Legislative Session on the south lawn of the Capitol
13 grounds to pay tribute to the contributions of Tejanos to the State
14 of Texas. The committees shall establish rules and policies
15 necessary to place the monument on the south lawn of the Capitol.

16 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
20 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Chapter 443, Government Code, is amended by
6 adding Section 443.01525 to read as follows:

7 Sec. 443.01525. TEJANO MEMORIAL MONUMENT. The State
8 Preservation Board shall establish a Tejano memorial monument on
9 the historic south grounds of the Capitol that pays tribute to the
10 contributions of Tejanos to the State of Texas.

11 SECTION 2. Section 443.0152, Government Code, is amended by
12 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:

13 (a-1) Except as provided by Sections 443.01525 and 448.034,
14 after September 1, 2009, no additional monuments may be placed on
15 the historic grounds of the Capitol.

16 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
20 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
