H.B. No. 4817

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT
2 relating to the creation of the Goodwater Municipal Utility
3 District No. 1; providing authority to impose taxes and issue
4 bonds; granting a limited power of eminent domain.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subtitle X, Title 6, Special District Local Laws
7 Code, is amended by adding Chapter 11004 to read as follows:

8 CHAPTER 11004. GOODWATER MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 1

9 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

10 Sec. 11004.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

11 (1) "Board" means the district's board of directors.

12 (2) "Director" means a board member.

13 (3) "District" means the Goodwater Municipal Utility
14 District No. 1.

15 Sec. 11004.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a
16 combined powers district created under Section 59, Article XVI,
17 Texas Constitution.

18 Sec. 11004.003. CONFIRMATION AND DIRECTORS' ELECTION
19 REQUIRED. The temporary directors shall hold an election to
20 confirm the creation of the district and to elect five permanent
21 directors as provided by Section 49.102, Water Code.

22 Sec. 11004.004. CONSENT OF MUNICIPALITY REQUIRED. The
23 temporary directors may not hold an election under Section
24 11004.003 until each municipality in whose corporate limits or

1 extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located has
2 consented by ordinance or resolution to the creation of the
3 district and to the inclusion of land in the district.

4 Sec. 11004.005. FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE AND BENEFIT.

5 (a) The district is created to serve a public purpose and benefit.

6 (b) The district is created to accomplish the purposes of:

7 (1) a municipal utility district as provided by
8 general law and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution;

9 (2) Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, that
10 relate to the construction, acquisition, improvement, operation,
11 or maintenance of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or
12 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads; and

13 (3) Section 52-a, Article III, Texas Constitution, to
14 promote, develop, encourage, and maintain employment, commerce,
15 economic development, and the public welfare in the district.

16 Sec. 11004.006. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The
17 district is initially composed of the territory described by
18 Section 2 of the Act creating this chapter.

19 (b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of
20 the Act creating this chapter form a closure. A mistake made in the
21 field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process
22 does not affect the district's:

23 (1) organization, existence, or validity;

24 (2) right to issue any type of bond for the purposes
25 for which the district is created or to pay the principal of and
26 interest on a bond;

27 (3) right to impose a tax; or

1 (4) legality or operation.

2 Sec. 11004.007. RELATION TO OTHER LAW. If any provision of
3 the general law, including a provision incorporated by reference in
4 this chapter, is in conflict or inconsistent with this chapter,
5 this chapter prevails.

6 Sec. 11004.008. LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION OF CHAPTER. This
7 chapter shall be liberally construed in conformity with the
8 findings and purposes stated in this chapter.

9 [Sections 11004.009-11004.050 reserved for expansion]

10 SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

11 Sec. 11004.051. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district is
12 governed by a board of five elected directors.

13 (b) Except as provided by Section 11004.052, directors
14 serve staggered four-year terms.

15 Sec. 11004.052. TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) On or after the
16 effective date of the Act creating this chapter, the owner or owners
17 of a majority of the assessed value of the real property in the
18 district may submit a petition to the Texas Commission on
19 Environmental Quality requesting that the commission appoint as
20 temporary directors the five persons named in the petition. The
21 commission shall appoint as temporary directors the five persons
22 named in the petition.

23 (b) Temporary directors serve until the earlier of:

24 (1) the date permanent directors are elected under
25 Section 11004.003; or

26 (2) the fourth anniversary of the effective date of
27 the Act creating this chapter.

1 (c) If permanent directors have not been elected under
2 Section 11004.003 and the terms of the temporary directors have
3 expired, successor temporary directors shall be appointed or
4 reappointed as provided by Subsection (d) to serve terms that
5 expire on the earlier of:

6 (1) the date permanent directors are elected under
7 Section 11004.003; or

8 (2) the fourth anniversary of the date of the
9 appointment or reappointment.

10 (d) If Subsection (c) applies, the owner or owners of a
11 majority of the assessed value of the real property in the district
12 may submit a petition to the Texas Commission on Environmental
13 Quality requesting that the commission appoint as successor
14 temporary directors the five persons named in the petition. The
15 commission shall appoint as successor temporary directors the five
16 persons named in the petition.

17 [Sections 11004.053-11004.100 reserved for expansion]

18 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES

19 Sec. 11004.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The district
20 has the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes for
21 which the district is created.

22 Sec. 11004.102. MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT POWERS AND
23 DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties provided by the
24 general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code,
25 applicable to municipal utility districts created under Section 59,
26 Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

27 Sec. 11004.103. AUTHORITY FOR ROAD PROJECTS. Under Section

1 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the district may design,
2 acquire, construct, finance, issue bonds for, improve, operate,
3 maintain, and convey to this state, a county, or a municipality for
4 operation and maintenance macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or
5 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads.

6 Sec. 11004.104. ROAD STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a) A
7 road project must meet all applicable construction standards,
8 zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulations of each
9 municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial
10 jurisdiction the road project is located.

11 (b) If a road project is not located in the corporate limits
12 or extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality, the road
13 project must meet all applicable construction standards,
14 subdivision requirements, and regulations of each county in which
15 the road project is located.

16 (c) If the state will maintain and operate the road, the
17 Texas Transportation Commission must approve the plans and
18 specifications of the road project.

19 Sec. 11004.105. STREET REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE. (a) After
20 the 10th anniversary of the effective date of the Act creating this
21 chapter, the district, at the district's expense, shall repair and
22 maintain any streets in the district.

23 (b) A district's repair and maintenance of streets under
24 this section must meet all applicable construction standards and
25 regulations of the City of Georgetown and Williamson County.

26 Sec. 11004.106. REGIONAL WASTE DISPOSAL POWERS AND DUTIES.
27 The district has the powers and duties applicable to a district

1 under Chapter 30, Water Code.

2 Sec. 11004.107. WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY DESIGN
3 APPROVAL. The district must obtain the approval of the Brazos River
4 Authority for the design of any district wastewater treatment
5 facility.

6 Sec. 11004.108. WASTEWATER SERVICE PROVIDERS. Only the
7 Brazos River Authority or a provider approved by the Brazos River
8 Authority may provide wastewater service in the district.

9 Sec. 11004.109. COMPLIANCE WITH FEBRUARY 2005 AGREEMENT.
10 The district shall comply with the terms of the "Agreement
11 Regarding Sewer Services Areas and Customers" among the Lower
12 Colorado River Authority, the Brazos River Authority, the City of
13 Georgetown, the City of Liberty Hill, and the Chisholm Trail
14 Special Utility District dated February 1, 2005.

15 Sec. 11004.110. DIVISION OF DISTRICT. (a) Subject to this
16 section, the district may divide into two or more contiguous
17 districts as provided by Sections 51.748, 51.749, 51.750, 51.751,
18 51.752, and 51.753, Water Code. For the purpose of applying those
19 sections, the district shall be considered an original district and
20 a reference to "this chapter" shall be considered a reference to
21 Chapter 54, Water Code.

22 (b) This chapter applies to any new district created by the
23 division of the original district. Except as provided by
24 Subsection (c), a new district has all the powers and duties of the
25 original district.

26 (c) A district created by the division of the original
27 district may not divide into two or more districts.

1 Sec. 11004.111. COMPLIANCE WITH MUNICIPAL CONSENT
2 ORDINANCE OR RESOLUTION. The district shall comply with all
3 applicable requirements of any ordinance or resolution that is
4 adopted under Section 54.016 or 54.0165, Water Code, and that
5 consents to the creation of the district or to the inclusion of land
6 in the district.

7 Sec. 11004.112. LIBRARIES. The district may exercise the
8 powers of a library district under Chapter 326, Local Government
9 Code.

10 Sec. 11004.113. EXERCISE OF POWERS OF DEVELOPMENT
11 CORPORATION. The district may exercise the powers of a development
12 corporation under Chapter 505, Local Government Code.

13 Sec. 11004.114. LIMITATION ON USE OF EMINENT DOMAIN. The
14 district may not exercise the power of eminent domain outside the
15 district to acquire a site or easement for:

16 (1) a road project authorized by Section 11004.103;

17 or

18 (2) a recreational facility as defined by Section
19 49.462, Water Code.

20 [Sections 11004.115-11004.150 reserved for expansion]

21 SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

22 Sec. 11004.151. ELECTIONS REGARDING TAXES OR BONDS. (a)
23 The district may issue, without an election, bonds and other
24 obligations secured by:

25 (1) revenue other than ad valorem taxes; or

26 (2) contract payments described by Section 11004.153.

27 (b) The district must hold an election in the manner

1 provided by Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, to obtain voter approval
2 before the district may impose an ad valorem tax, impose a sales or
3 use tax, or issue bonds payable from ad valorem taxes.

4 (c) The district may not issue bonds payable from ad valorem
5 taxes to finance a road project unless the issuance is approved by a
6 vote of a two-thirds majority of the district voters voting at an
7 election held for that purpose.

8 Sec. 11004.152. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) If
9 authorized at an election held under Section 11004.151, the
10 district may impose an operation and maintenance tax on taxable
11 property in the district in accordance with Section 49.107, Water
12 Code.

13 (b) The board shall determine the tax rate. The rate may not
14 exceed the rate approved at the election.

15 Sec. 11004.153. CONTRACT TAXES. (a) In accordance with
16 Section 49.108, Water Code, the district may impose a tax other than
17 an operation and maintenance tax and use the revenue derived from
18 the tax to make payments under a contract after the provisions of
19 the contract have been approved by a majority of the district voters
20 voting at an election held for that purpose.

21 (b) A contract approved by the district voters may contain a
22 provision stating that the contract may be modified or amended by
23 the board without further voter approval.

24 Sec. 11004.154. HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX. (a) In this section:

25 (1) "Hotel" has the meaning assigned by Section
26 156.001, Tax Code.

27 (2) "Room rate" means the amount charged by a hotel for

1 a person's use or possession of a room for the period of rental.

2 Room rate does not include:

3 (A) the cost of food served by the hotel; or

4 (B) the cost of personal services performed by
5 the hotel for the person, except for those services related to
6 cleaning the room or preparing the room for the next occupant.

7 (b) The board by order or resolution may impose a hotel
8 occupancy tax on a person who pays for the use or possession or for
9 the right to the use or possession of a room that:

10 (1) is in a hotel located in the district;

11 (2) costs \$2 or more each day; and

12 (3) is ordinarily used for sleeping.

13 (c) The district's revenue from a hotel occupancy tax may be
14 used for any district purpose.

15 (d) The amount of the hotel occupancy tax shall be the
16 greater of:

17 (1) nine percent of the room rate; or

18 (2) the rate imposed by the municipality in whose
19 extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located.

20 (e) The district may examine and receive information
21 related to the imposition of hotel occupancy taxes to the same
22 extent as if the district were a county.

23 [Sections 11004.155-11004.200 reserved for expansion]

24 SUBCHAPTER E. BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS

25 Sec. 11004.201. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER
26 OBLIGATIONS. The district may issue bonds or other obligations
27 payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, impact fees,

1 revenue, contract payments, grants, or other district money, or any
2 combination of those sources, to pay for any authorized district
3 purpose.

4 Sec. 11004.202. TAXES FOR BONDS. At the time the district
5 issues bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, the
6 board shall provide for the annual imposition of a continuing
7 direct ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount, while all
8 or part of the bonds are outstanding as required and in the manner
9 provided by Sections 54.601 and 54.602, Water Code.

10 Sec. 11004.203. BONDS FOR ROAD PROJECTS. At the time of
11 issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations
12 issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad
13 valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of the
14 real property in the district.

15 [Sections 11004.204-11004.250 reserved for expansion]

16 SUBCHAPTER F. SALES AND USE TAX

17 Sec. 11004.251. SALES AND USE TAX. (a) In this section:

18 (1) "Taxable item" means any item or service that
19 could be subject to a sales and use tax imposed by Williamson
20 County.

21 (2) "Use," with respect to a taxable service, means
22 the derivation in the district of a direct or indirect benefit from
23 the service.

24 (b) The district may adopt a sales and use tax after an
25 election in which the majority of the voters of the district voting
26 in the election authorize the adoption of the tax.

27 (c) If the district adopts a sales and use tax, a tax is

1 imposed on the receipts from the sale at retail of taxable items in
2 the district, and an excise tax is imposed on the use, storage, or
3 other consumption in the district of taxable items purchased,
4 leased, or rented from a retailer in the district during the period
5 that the sales and use tax is in effect.

6 (d) The district may impose the sales and use tax in
7 increments of one-eighth of one percent, with a minimum tax rate of
8 one-half percent and a maximum rate of two percent.

9 (e) The rate of the excise tax is the same as the rate of the
10 sales tax portion of the tax and is applied to the sales price of the
11 taxable item.

12 Sec. 11004.252. SALES AND USE TAX; ELECTION. (a) Except as
13 provided by Subsection (g), the board by order may call an election
14 to adopt, abolish, or change the rate of a sales and use tax. The
15 election may be held in conjunction with a directors' election.

16 (b) The district shall provide notice of the election and
17 shall hold the election in the manner prescribed for a bond election
18 by Subchapter D, Chapter 49, Water Code.

19 (c) In an election to adopt a sales and use tax, the ballots
20 shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the
21 proposition: "The adoption of a local sales and use tax in the
22 Goodwater Municipal Utility District No. 1 at a rate of (proposed
23 tax rate) percent."

24 (d) In an election to change the rate of a sales and use tax,
25 the ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against
26 the proposition: "The (increase or decrease, as applicable) in the
27 rate of the local sales and use tax in the Goodwater Municipal

1 Utility District No. 1 from (tax rate on election date) percent to
2 (proposed tax rate) percent."

3 (e) In an election to abolish a sales and use tax, the
4 ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the
5 proposition: "The abolition of the local sales and use tax in the
6 Goodwater Municipal Utility District No. 1."

7 (f) Except as provided by Subsection (g), the board by order
8 may abolish the sales and use tax without an election.

9 (g) The board may not call an election to abolish the sales
10 and use tax or to reduce the rate of the sales and use tax below the
11 amount pledged to secure payment of any outstanding district debt
12 if any district debt remains outstanding.

13 Sec. 11004.253. SALES AND USE TAX; ADMINISTRATION. (a)
14 Chapter 323, Tax Code, to the extent not inconsistent with this
15 subchapter, governs the application, collection, and
16 administration of the sales and use tax. Subtitles A and B, Title
17 2, and Chapter 151, Tax Code, govern the administration and
18 enforcement of the sales and use tax and the excise tax.

19 (b) Sections 323.401 through 323.406, and 323.505, Tax
20 Code, do not apply to the district. Chapter 323, Tax Code, does not
21 apply to the use and allocation of revenue under this chapter.

22 (c) In applying Chapter 323, Tax Code, a reference in that
23 chapter to:

24 (1) "county" means the district; and

25 (2) "commissioners court" means the board.

26 (d) The district is entitled to examine and receive
27 information related to the imposition and collection of the sales

1 and use tax to the same extent as a municipality under Subchapter D,
2 Chapter 321, Tax Code.

3 Sec. 11004.254. USE OF SALES AND USE TAX PROCEEDS. The
4 district may use the proceeds of a sales and use tax collected under
5 this subchapter for any purpose authorized by this chapter.

6 Sec. 11004.255. SALES AND USE TAXES; EFFECTIVE DATE. The
7 adoption of a sales and use tax or a change in the sales and use tax
8 rate under this subchapter takes effect after the expiration of the
9 first complete calendar quarter occurring after the date on which
10 the comptroller receives notice of the results of the election.

11 SECTION 2. The Goodwater Municipal Utility District No. 1
12 initially includes all the territory contained in the following
13 area:

14 TRACT ONE:

15 BEING 414.78 acres of the Burrell Eaves Survey, Abstract No.
16 216, in Williamson County, Texas. This tract includes part of the
17 property (3 tracts) which were conveyed to J. N. Adkins, et ux. of
18 record in Vol. 328, Pg. 331, Deed Records of Williamson County,
19 Texas. This tract was surveyed on the ground in August of 2005, by
20 William F. Forest, Jr., Registered Professional Land Surveyor No.
21 1847.

22 BEGINNING at an iron pin which was set at the Northeast fence
23 corner of the J.N. Adkins tract called 34.2 acres (Tract 2) as
24 described in Vol. 328, Pg. 331. This corner exists at the
25 intersection of the South line of County Road 147 with the West line
26 of County Road 234.

27 THENCE along or near the general line of an existing fence

1 with the West line of County Road 234, setting iron pins as follows;
2 S 14 deg. 12 min. 16 sec. W 1006.11 feet; S 14 deg. 51 min. 53 sec. W
3 992.84 feet; and S 13 deg. 33 min. 34 sec. W 416.78 feet to the
4 Northeast corner of the 4 1/4 acre property conveyed to the Church
5 of Christ at Strickland Grove by deed of record in Vol. 111, Pg.
6 510.

7 THENCE with the North line of the Church tract (upstream with
8 the approximate center of Bee Branch), setting iron pins as
9 follows; S 86 deg, 12 min. 17 sec. W 65.40 feet; S 68 deg. 12 min. 42
10 sec. W 142.18 feet; N 68 deg. 33 min. 45 sec. W 28.04 feet; N 41 deg.
11 48 min. 23 sec. W 175.27 feet; S 79 deg. 35 min. 37 sec. W 102.40
12 feet; and S 67 deg. 20 min. 59 sec. W 225.13 feet.

13 THENCE with the boundary of a 100 acre tract surveyed this
14 date, S 88 deg. 21 min. 38 sec. W 1669.98 feet to an iron pin set;
15 and S 31 deg. 30 min. 55 sec. W 1459.02 feet to an iron pin set.

16 THENCE with the North line of State Highway 195, along or near
17 the general line of an existing fence, finding concrete
18 right-of-way markers, N 58 deg. 29 min. 05 sec. W 252.06 feet; N 58
19 deg. 28 min. 23 sec. W 2000.17 feet; and N 58 deg. 29 min. 43 sec. W
20 289.47 feet to an iron pin found.

21 THENCE with the East boundary of the Crisanto Perez property
22 described in Vol. 1470, pg. 298, along or near the general line of
23 an existing fence, N 23 deg. 39 min. 06 sec. W 2206.68 feet to a pipe
24 post found.

25 THENCE with the boundary of County Road 147, along or near the
26 general line of an existing fence setting iron pins as follows; N 69
27 deg. 45 min. 29 sec. E 422.90 feet; N 69 deg. 55 min. 48 sec. E

1 1885.44 feet; N 70 deg. 04 min. 45 sec. E 2297.59 feet; N 87 deg. 50
2 min. 55 sec. E 59.60 feet; S 19 deg. 47 min. 36 sec. E 1977.28 feet;
3 and N 70 deg. 44 min. 56 sec. E 1774.08 feet to the POINT OF
4 BEGINNING.

5 TRACT TWO:

6 A tract or parcel of land containing 4.988 acres of land out
7 of the Burrell Eaves Survey, Abstract No. 216, Williamson County,
8 Texas, being all of a called 4.99 acre tract conveyed to the William
9 Erwin Kemp and Margaret Elizabeth Kemp Trust recorded under
10 Document No. 2001006723 of the Official Public Records Of
11 Williamson County, Texas, said 4.988 acres being more particularly
12 described by metes and bounds as follows:

13 BEGINNING at a 1/2 inch iron rod found at the most westerly corner
14 of the herein described tract, being a southerly corner of said
15 Third Tract, a residue of a 140.8 acre tract conveyed to J.N.
16 Adkins, et ux recorded in Volume 328, Page 331 of the Deed Records
17 of Williamson County, Texas and lying in the northeasterly
18 right-of-way line of Highway 195;

19 Thence, North 50°55'10" East, along an interior line of said Third
20 Tract, a distance of 467.27 feet to a 1/2 inch iron rod found at the
21 most northerly corner of the herein described tract;

22 Thence, South 33°00'00" East (Bearing Basis), along an interior line
23 of said Third Tract, a distance of 707.49 feet to a 1/2 inch iron rod
24 found at the most east corner of the herein described tract and
25 lying in the northerly right-of-way line of County Road 143;

26 Thence, South 70°37'00" West, along the northerly right-of-way line
27 of said County Road 143, a distance of 147.18 feet to a 1/2 inch iron

1 rod set at an angle point of the herein described tract;
2 Thence, South $73^{\circ}57'48''$ West, continuing along the northerly
3 right-of-way line of said County Road 143, a distance of 60.48 feet
4 to a 1/2 inch iron rod found at the most southerly corner of the
5 herein described tract, being in the northeasterly right-of-way
6 line of said Highway 195 and being the beginning of a curve to the
7 left;

8 Thence, along the northeasterly right-of-way line of said Highway
9 195 along said curve to the left through a central angle of $02^{\circ}12'49''$
10 to a 1/2 inch iron rod set for a point of tangency, said curve having
11 a radius of 8235.11 feet, an arc length of 318.14 feet, and a long
12 chord bearing of North $56^{\circ}00'26''$ West, 318.12 feet;

13 Thence, North $57^{\circ}01'00''$ West, continuing along the northeasterly
14 right-of-way line of said Highway 195, a distance of 342.54 feet to
15 the POINT OF BEGINNING, containing 4.988 acres of land.

16 TRACT THREE:

17 Being 1.00 acre of the Burrell Eaves Survey, Abstract No.
18 261, in Williamson County, Texas, part of a 103 acre tract which is
19 described in Vol. 757, Page 461, Deed Records of Williamson County,
20 Texas. Surveyed on the ground in October of 1984, by W.F. Forest,
21 Registered Public Surveyor No. 101.

22 BEGINNING at an iron pin set about 1 foot North of a fence in the
23 North line of County Road 147, 35 feet wide. A nail set by the
24 Southeast fence corner of the said 103 acre tract bears N $72^{\circ}07'$ E
25 251.03 feet.

26 THENCE S $72^{\circ}07'$ W 150.0 feet to set an iron pin.

27 THENCE N $17^{\circ}53''$ W 290.4 feet to set an iron pin.

1 THENCE N 72°07' E 150.0 feet to set an iron pin.

2 THENCE S 17°53' E 290.4 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING.

3 TRACT FOUR:

4 Being 5.00 acres of land located in the Burrell Eaves Survey,
5 Abstract No. 216, Williamson County, Texas, being out of and part of
6 that certain 103 acre tract as recorded in document no. 2002078621,
7 Official Public Records of Williamson County, Texas,
8 (O.P.R.W.C.T.), being the same 5.00 acres conveyed to Carl
9 Satterlee, et ux by deed recorded in Document No. 2001019450,
10 O.P.R.W.C.T., and being more particularly described by metes and
11 bounds as follows: (all bearings recited herein ARE BASED ON THE
12 MONUMENTED NORTH LINE OF THE SAID 103 ACRES);

5 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the
6 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
7 representatives within the required time.

10 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subtitle X, Title 6, Special District Local
7 Laws Code, is amended by adding Chapter 11004 to read as
8 follows:

9 CHAPTER 11004. GOODWATER MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 1

10 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

11 Sec. 11004.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

12 (1) "Board" means the district's board of directors.

13 (2) "Director" means a board member.

14 (3) "District" means the Goodwater Municipal Utility

15 District No. 1.

16 Sec. 11004.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a

17 combined powers district created under Section 59, Article XVI,

18 Texas Constitution.

19 Sec. 11004.003. CONFIRMATION AND DIRECTORS' ELECTION

20 REQUIRED. The temporary directors shall hold an election to

21 confirm the creation of the district and to elect five permanent

22 directors as provided by Section 49.102, Water Code.

23 Sec. 11004.004. CONSENT OF MUNICIPALITY REQUIRED. The

24 temporary directors may not hold an election under Section

1 11004.003 until each municipality in whose corporate limits or
2 extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located has
3 consented by ordinance or resolution to the creation of the
4 district and to the inclusion of land in the district.

5 Sec. 11004.005. FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE AND BENEFIT.

6 (a) The district is created to serve a public purpose and
7 benefit.

8 (b) The district is created to accomplish the purposes of:

9 (1) a municipal utility district as provided by
10 general law and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution;

11 (2) Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, that
12 relate to the construction, acquisition, improvement, operation,
13 or maintenance of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or
14 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads;
15 and

16 (3) Section 52-a, Article III, Texas Constitution, to

5 Sec. 11004.007. RELATION TO OTHER LAW. If any provision

9 Sec. 11004.008. LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION OF CHAPTER. This
10 chapter shall be liberally construed in conformity with the
11 findings and purposes stated in this chapter.

13 SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

14 Sec. 11004.051. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district
15 is governed by a board of five elected directors.

16 (b) Except as provided by Section 11004.052, directors
17 serve staggered four-year terms.

18 Sec. 11004.052. TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) On or after the
19 effective date of the Act creating this chapter, the owner or
20 owners of a majority of the assessed value of the real property
21 in the district may submit a petition to the Texas Commission on
22 Environmental Quality requesting that the commission appoint as
23 temporary directors the five persons named in the petition. The
24 commission shall appoint as temporary directors the five persons
25 named in the petition.

26 (b) Temporary directors serve until the earlier of:

27 (1) the date permanent directors are elected under

1 Section 11004.003; or

2 (2) the fourth anniversary of the effective date of
3 the Act creating this chapter.

4 (c) If permanent directors have not been elected under
5 Section 11004.003 and the terms of the temporary directors have
6 expired, successor temporary directors shall be appointed or
7 reappointed as provided by Subsection (d) to serve terms that
8 expire on the earlier of:

9 (1) the date permanent directors are elected under
10 Section 11004.003; or

11 (2) the fourth anniversary of the date of the
12 appointment or reappointment.

13 (d) If Subsection (c) applies, the owner or owners of a
14 majority of the assessed value of the real property in the
15 district may submit a petition to the Texas Commission on
16 Environmental Quality requesting that the commission appoint as
17 successor temporary directors the five persons named in the
18 petition. The commission shall appoint as successor temporary
19 directors the five persons named in the petition.

21 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES

22 Sec. 11004.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The district
23 has the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes
24 for which the district is created.

25 Sec. 11004.102. MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT POWERS AND
26 DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties provided by the
27 general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water

1 Code, applicable to municipal utility districts created under
2 Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

3 Sec. 11004.103. AUTHORITY FOR ROAD PROJECTS. Under
4 Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the district may
5 design, acquire, construct, finance, issue bonds for, improve,
6 operate, maintain, and convey to this state, a county, or a
7 municipality for operation and maintenance macadamized,
8 graveled, or paved roads, or improvements, including storm
9 drainage, in aid of those roads.

10 Sec. 11004.104. ROAD STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a) A
11 road project must meet all applicable construction standards,
12 zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulations of each
13 municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial
14 jurisdiction the road project is located.

15 (b) If a road project is not located in the corporate
16 limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality, the
17 road project must meet all applicable construction standards,
18 subdivision requirements, and regulations of each county in
19 which the road project is located.

20 (c) If the state will maintain and operate the road, the
21 Texas Transportation Commission must approve the plans and
22 specifications of the road project.

23 Sec. 11004.105. STREET REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE. (a) After
24 the 10th anniversary of the effective date of the Act creating
25 this chapter, the district, at the district's expense, shall
26 repair and maintain any streets in the district.

27 (b) A district's repair and maintenance of streets under

1 this section must meet all applicable construction standards and
2 regulations of the City of Georgetown and Williamson County.

3 Sec. 11004.106. REGIONAL WASTE DISPOSAL POWERS AND DUTIES.

4 The district has the powers and duties applicable to a district
5 under Chapter 30, Water Code.

6 Sec. 11004.107. WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY DESIGN

7 APPROVAL. The district must obtain the approval of the Brazos
8 River Authority for the design of any district wastewater
9 treatment facility.

10 Sec. 11004.108. WASTEWATER SERVICE PROVIDERS. Only the

11 Brazos River Authority or a provider approved by the Brazos
12 River Authority may provide wastewater service in the district.

13 Sec. 11004.109. COMPLIANCE WITH FEBRUARY 2005 AGREEMENT.

14 The district shall comply with the terms of the "Agreement
15 Regarding Sewer Services Areas and Customers" among the Lower
16 Colorado River Authority, the Brazos River Authority, the City
17 of Georgetown, the City of Liberty Hill, and the Chisholm Trail
18 Special Utility District dated February 1, 2005.

19 Sec. 11004.110. DIVISION OF DISTRICT. (a) The district

20 may be divided into two or more new districts only if:

21 (1) the district has no outstanding bonded debt; and

22 (2) the district is not imposing ad valorem taxes.

23 (b) This chapter applies to any new district created by

24 the division of the district, and a new district has all the
25 powers and duties of the district.

26 (c) Any new district created by the division of the

27 district may not, at the time the new district is created,

1 contain any land outside the area described by Section 2 of the
2 Act creating this chapter.

3 (d) The board, on its own motion or on receipt of a
