House Bill 2104 Senate Amendments Section-by-Section Analysis

HOUSE VERSION

SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 102, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended by adding Section 102.82 to read as follows:

Sec. 102.82. STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS. A person must bring suit on an action arising under this chapter not later than four years after the day the cause of action accrues.

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a cause of action that accrues on or after the effective date of this Act. A cause of action that accrues before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

SENATE VERSION

SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 102, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended by adding Section 102.82 to read as follows:

Sec. 102.82. STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS. A person must bring suit on an action arising under this chapter not later than four years after the day the cause of action accrues. If a termination related to a change in ownership of the brand in the manufacturing tier occurs, the cause of action accrues when either the new brand owner or the transferring or selling brand owner provides notice of termination to the distributor.

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a cause of action that accrues on or after the effective date of this Act. A cause of action that accrues before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose. Under existing law, it is the policy of this State that the protections provided to distributors in Subchapters C and D, Chapter 102, Alcoholic Beverage Code, apply to a distributor regardless of whether there is a transfer or change of ownership of a brand in the manufacturing tier and such causes of actions will be subject to the same statute of limitations as any other cause of action brought under this Chapter.
