SECTION 1. Section 113.085, Property Code, is amended by amending Subsections (c) and (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as follows:

(c) A cotrustee shall participate in the performance of a trustee's function unless the cotrustee:

(1) is unavailable to perform the function because of absence, illness, <u>suspension under this code</u>, disqualification under other law, or other temporary incapacity; or

(2) has delegated the performance of the function to another trustee in accordance with the terms of the trust or applicable law, has communicated the delegation to all other cotrustees, and has filed the delegation in the records of the trust.

(d) If a cotrustee is unavailable to participate in the performance of a trustee's function for a reason described by Subsection (c)(1) and prompt action is necessary to achieve the <u>efficient administration or</u> purposes of the trust or to avoid injury to the trust property <u>or a beneficiary</u>, the remaining cotrustee or a majority of the remaining cotrustees may act for the trust.

(d-1) If a cotrustee is unavailable to participate in the performance of the cotrustee's function because the cotrustee has been suspended under this code, the remaining cotrustee or cotrustees may act for the trust as provided by the order of the court that suspended the cotrustee or another order of that court.

SECTION 1. Sections 113.085(c) and (d), Property Code, are amended to read as follows:

(c) A cotrustee shall participate in the performance of a trustee's function unless the cotrustee:

(1) is unavailable to perform the function because of absence, illness, <u>suspension under this code or other law</u>, disqualification, <u>if any</u>, under <u>this code</u>, <u>disqualification</u> <u>under</u> other law, or other temporary incapacity; or

(2) has delegated the performance of the function to another trustee in accordance with the terms of the trust or applicable law, has communicated the delegation to all other cotrustees, and has filed the delegation in the records of the trust.

(d) If a cotrustee is unavailable to participate in the performance of a trustee's function for a reason described by Subsection (c)(1) and prompt action is necessary to achieve the <u>efficient administration or</u> purposes of the trust or to avoid injury to the trust property <u>or a</u> <u>beneficiary</u>, the remaining cotrustee or a majority of the remaining cotrustees may act for the trust.
