SECTION 1. Section 11.203(d), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

(d) A principal <u>who was employed as a principal at a</u> <u>campus that was</u> [of a campus] rated academically unacceptable <u>during the preceding school year</u> [, as well as any person employed to replace that principal,] shall participate in the program and complete the program requirements not later than a date determined by the commissioner.

SECTION 2. Section 11.203(d), Education Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a principal employed at a school that is rated academically unacceptable during the 2008-2009 school year.

SECTION 3. It is the intent of the legislature that the passage of H.B. No. 3, Acts of the 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009, with any amendments to Section 11.203(d), Education Code, and the amendments made by this Act shall be harmonized, if possible, as provided by Section 311.025(b), Government Code, so that effect may be given to each. If amendments made to Section 11.203(d), Education Code, by H.B. No. 3, Acts of the 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009, and the amendments to Section 11.203(d), Education 11.203(d), Education Code, by H.B. Regular Session, 2009, prevail, regardless of the relative dates of enactment of this Act and H.B. No. 3, Acts of the 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009, but only to the extent that any differences are irreconcilable.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
