- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.103(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The board of trustees of a school district may terminate
- 8 the employment of a teacher employed under a probationary contract
- 9 at the end of the contract period if in the board's judgment the
- 10 best interests of the district will be served by terminating the
- 11 employment. The board of trustees must give notice of its decision
- 12 to terminate the employment to the teacher not later than the <u>15th</u>
- 13 [45th] day before the last day of instruction required under the
- 14 contract. The notice must be delivered personally to the teacher or
- 15 mailed by prepaid certified mail to the teacher's address of record
- 16 with the district. Notice that is mailed in accordance with this
- 17 subsection is considered given at the time of mailing. The board's
- 18 decision is final and may not be appealed.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 21.206(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 (a) Not later than the 15th [45th] day before the last day of
- 22 instruction in a school year, the board of trustees shall notify in
- 23 writing each teacher whose contract is about to expire whether the
- 24 board proposes to renew or not renew the contract. The notice must

- 1 be delivered personally to the teacher or mailed by prepaid
- 2 certified mail to the teacher's address of record with the
- 3 district. Notice that is mailed in accordance with this subsection
- 4 <u>is considered given at the time of mailing.</u>
- 5 SECTION 3. The change in law made by Sections 21.103 and
- 6 21.206, Education Code, as amended by this Act, applies beginning
- 7 with contracts for the 2012-2013 school year.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 9 last day of the legislative session.
