16 WHEREAS, Now an employee at Cam-Tech Manufacturing, Mr.
17 Carlisle is an avid cyclist, computer guru, and crossword puzzle
18 enthusiast; in addition to his dedicated involvement in Kiwanis
19 International, he is a member of the Maverick Athletic Club in
20 Arlington and has spent time there nearly every morning for 30
21 years; and

23 by his wife, Jane, and his three children, Bill, Steve, and Andrea;
