- 14 vice president of the Gulf Coast Youth Soccer Club; in addition, he

- 17 the board of Communities In Schools and chair of Foster
- 18 Grandparents of Southeast Texas and of the Community Resource
- 19 Coordination Group of Jefferson and Hardin Counties; moreover, he

- 21 Foster Grandparent Program and was selected as the Don Kelly
- 22 Southeast Texan of the Year in 2010; and
