1 WHEREAS, Texas Junior State of America is celebrating its
2 20th anniversary in 2011, and this notable milestone in its history
3 is indeed deserving of special recognition; and

4 WHEREAS, An organization run by its membership of high school
5 students, Junior State of America is dedicated to fighting
6 political apathy among young people, training the next generation
7 of citizens for active participation in democracy, educating youth
8 about the federal, state, and local issues that affect their lives,
9 and elevating public discourse and political debate; in Texas, JSA
10 has established chapters on more than 50 high school campuses
11 throughout the state; and

12 WHEREAS, In the course of its history, Texas JSA has
13 sponsored nearly 60 political awareness conventions in addition to
14 annual conferences and other events; these gatherings provide
15 participants with a range of valuable experiences, such as
16 conducting elections and submitting bills to a mock Congress, as

18 politicians, journalists, and public policy experts; moreover, its
19 Institute on Politics and Presidential Leadership has introduced
20 hundreds of young Texans to policies and individuals that have
21 played an instrumental role in American government; and
