citizens with the passing of David Coulter Templeton on June 12,
2011, at the age of 84; and

WHEREAS, Born in Marshall on September 17, 1926, Coulter 4 5 Templeton was the son of C. B. and Bernice Templeton; he spent much of his childhood in Avinger with his grandfather, who taught him 6 7 about lumber and construction; after graduating from Mineola High School, he served as a pharmacist's mate in the United States Navy 8 9 during World War II; he went on to earn his bachelor's degree in business administration from Southern Methodist University, where 10 he joined the Kappa Sigma fraternity and played saxophone in the 11 12 Mustang Band; and

13 WHEREAS, This dynamic Texan founded the Coulter Templeton 14 Lumber Company in Mineola in 1949, and he was also an investor and a founder of the Mineola State Bank; deeply committed to helping 15 others, he served as a trustee of the Meredith Foundation for 20 16 years, and he worked tirelessly on a variety of community projects, 17 including collecting aluminum cans for the Rotary Club; the club 18 named him a Paul Harris Fellow, and in 1990 the Mineola Chamber of 19 Commerce selected him as Man of the Year; and 20

21 WHEREAS, He married the love of his life, Jean Lynch 22 Templeton, at the age of 63, and became a father figure to her young 23 daughters, Jean and Mary, and a trusted friend to her sons, John, 24 Robert, and Dan; he was a longtime member of the First United

1 Methodist Church of Mineola and of the Cage Men's Class Sunday 2 School, and with his kind, gentle manner and marvelous sense of 3 humor, he endeared himself to numerous friends; and
