1 WHEREAS, The city of Austin lost a gifted musician and an 2 inspiring educator with the passing of Bruce Dinkins on June 22, 3 2011, at the age of 60; and

WHEREAS, A native of Buffalo, New York, Mr. Dinkins was born 4 5 on April 12, 1951, to Autumn and Claude Dinkins; he discovered his passion for the clarinet at an early age and earned the distinction 6 of first chair in the Florida All-State Band while he was still in 7 high school; he went on to earn his bachelor's degree in clarinet 8 9 performance from the University of Tampa and his master's degree from The New England Conservatory before pursuing additional 10 11 graduate studies at Florida State University and The Juilliard 12 School; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Dinkins toured Europe as part of the New England Conservatory Orchestra, featuring Gunther Schuller and Leonard Bernstein; he also performed with the Jacksonville and Macon Symphonies, conducted the Memphis Youth Symphony, and served as the conductor-in-residence of the Sewanee Summer Music Festival in Sewanee, Tennessee, for more than 25 summers; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Dinkins began his notable teaching career at Florida Junior College and Jacksonville University; he worked with Emory University in Atlanta and later became a high school band director, holding positions in Georgia and South Carolina before arriving in the Lone Star State; and

1 James Bowie High School in Austin; he was beloved by his students, and under his able direction, they achieved great success; in 2 3 addition to earning the University Interscholastic League concert and marching Sweepstakes awards every year, the group was honored 4 5 by the John Philip Sousa Foundation with the prestigious Sudler Shield and became Grand National Champions at the Smoky Mountain 6 Music Festival; Mr. Dinkins was also personally recognized with his 7 8 induction into the American Bandmasters Association, an accomplishment of which he was especially proud; and 9

10 WHEREAS, In all of his endeavors, he enjoyed the support of 11 his wife of 29 years, Hildy, and he took great joy in his children, 12 Jordan and Adam; and

WHEREAS, Though it is impossible to gauge the full effect of a man's life, some individuals leave their unmistakable mark on the world as they move through it, and Bruce Dinkins's contributions to his students and profession will long resonate in the lives of all who knew him; now, therefore, be it
