WHEREAS, She was honored in 2004 by *Hispanic* magazine as a Top Latina in Community Service, and in 2008 was named one of the 25 Most Influential Hispanics in Austin by La Voz de Austin, Austin Community College, and the Texas Association of Chicanos in Higher Education; and

WHEREAS, A woman of courage, strength, and generosity, she gave unselfishly to others, and her wisdom, her commitment to education, and her sensitivity toward others will not be forgotten by those who were privileged to share in her life; and

WHEREAS, She was a devoted wife, mother, and grandmother, and she leaves behind memories that will be treasured forever by her family and many friends; now, therefore, be it
