WHEREAS, The center's facility features a 120-seat black box theater, a visual arts gallery, dance studios, media arts, printmaking, and photography, as well as a full-service digital recording studio; and

WHEREAS, The center offers classes to help inspire people of all ages to appreciate the art of the African diaspora, and the center has truly become a valuable cultural asset to the community; in celebration of the center's 25th anniversary, special events have been planned for each Saturday in June; a community block party is being held on June 18, which will include cooking demonstrations, children's activities, a variety of exhibitions, a film screening, and tours of the center; now, therefore, be it
