- (1) has operated a motor vehicle on a highway while the 9

- is a habitual violator of the traffic laws; 15 (3)
- has permitted the unlawful or fraudulent use of 16

- (5) has committed an offense in another state or 18
- Canadian province that, if committed in this state, would be 19

- 21 (6) has been convicted of two or more separate

- 3 under Section 521.123] and [has been] convicted of [two or more]
- 4 moving violations committed within a 12-month period; or
- 5 (9) has committed an offense under Section 545.421.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 521.293, Transportation Code, is amended
- 7 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), if the person does
- 10 not request a hearing, the period of license suspension under
- 11 Section 521.292 is 180 90 days.
- 12 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 13 to an offense described by Section 521.292(a)(8), Transportation
- 14 Code, as amended by this Act, committed on or after the effective
- 15 date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of
- 16 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was
- 17 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 18 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed
- 19 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 20 occurred before that date.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
