8	(a) Except as provided by Subsections (b) and (c), an individual
9	may not be required to obtain or maintain coverage under an
10	individual health insurance policy.
11	(b) Subsection (a) does not apply to an individual who is
12	required to obtain or maintain health benefit plan coverage:
13	(1) by an institution of higher education at which the
14	individual is or will be enrolled as a student; or

3	imposed on an individual described in Section 1220.001(b) for the

6	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
7	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
8	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
9	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
10	Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
