- SECTION 2. Sections 411.1405(a) and (b), Government Code,
- 11 are amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) In this section, "state agency" [÷
- 13 [(1) "Information resources" and "information
- 14 resources technologies" have the meanings assigned by Section
- 15 2054.003.
- 16 [(2) "State agency"] means a department, commission,
- 17 board, office, council, authority, or other agency in the
- 18 executive, legislative, or judicial branch of state government that
- 19 is created by the constitution or a statute of this state, including
- 20 a university system or institution of higher education as defined
- 21 by Section 61.003, Education Code.
- 22 (b) To the extent consistent with Subsection (e), a state
- 23 agency is entitled to obtain from the department the criminal
- 24 history record information maintained by the department that

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- 1 relates to a person who[+
- $[\frac{1}{2}]$ is an employee, applicant for employment,
- 3 contractor, subcontractor, or intern or other volunteer with the
- 4 state agency or with a contractor or subcontractor for the state
- 5 agency[; and
- 6 [(2) has access to information resources or
- 7 information resources technologies, other than a desktop computer
- 8 or telephone station assigned to that person].
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
