- 2 relating to the minimum age and education requirements necessary to
- 3 obtain a hardship license.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 521.223, Transportation Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subsections (b), (c), (d), and (f) to read as follows:
- 7 (b) An applicant for a license under Subsection (a) must be
- 8 15 years and 180 days of age or older and must:
- 9 (1) have passed a driver education course approved by
- 10 the <u>Texas Education Agency and conducted by a licensed driver</u>
- 11 <u>education school</u> [department, which may be a course approved under
- 12 Section 521.205]; and
- 13 (2) pass the examination required by Section 521.161.
- 14 (c) To be eligible to take the driver training course, the
- 15 person must be at least 15 [14] years of age.
- 16 (d) If the department determines that an applicant must
- 17 assist in the responsibilities imposed by a family illness,
- 18 disability, death-related emergency, or economic emergency, the
- 19 <u>department</u> [it may waive the driver training course requirement
- 20 and] may issue a temporary license to an applicant who has satisfied
- 21 the requirements imposed by Subsection (b)(1). A temporary license
- 22 issued under this subsection is valid for 30 [60] days after the
- 23 date of issuance and may be renewed for additional 30-day [60-day]
- 24 periods as long as the condition continues.

- 1 (f) In the manner provided by Subchapter N, the department
- 2 <u>shall</u> [may] suspend a license issued under this section if the
- 3 holder of the license is convicted of a moving violation.
- 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to the issuance of a hardship license on or after the effective date
- 6 of this Act. The issuance of a hardship license before the
- 7 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect
- 8 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is
- 9 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
