- 2 relating to the temporary lowering of prima facie speed limits at a
- 3 vehicular accident reconstruction site.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 544.002(c), Transportation Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) A local authority may not place or maintain a
- 8 traffic-control device on a highway under the jurisdiction of the
- 9 Texas Department of Transportation without that department's
- 10 permission, except as authorized under Section 545.3561.
- 11 SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
- 12 is amended by adding Section 545.3561 to read as follows:
- Sec. 545.3561. AUTHORITY OF MUNICIPALITY OR COUNTY TO
- 14 TEMPORARILY LOWER SPEED LIMIT AT VEHICULAR ACCIDENT RECONSTRUCTION
- 15 SITE. (a) The governing body of a municipality by ordinance may
- 16 give a designated official discretion to temporarily lower a prima
- 17 facie speed limit for a highway or part of a highway in the
- 18 municipality, including a highway of the state highway system, at
- 19 the site of an investigation using vehicular accident
- 20 <u>reconstruction</u>.
- 21 (b) A county commissioners court by order may give a
- 22 <u>designated official discretion to temporarily lower prima facie</u>
- 23 speed limits for a county road or highway outside the boundaries of
- 24 a municipality at the site of an investigation using vehicular

- 1 accident reconstruction. The authority granted under this
- 2 subsection does not include a road or highway in the state highway
- 3 system.
- 4 (c) A designated official may temporarily lower prima facie
- 5 speed limits without the approval of or permission from the Texas
- 6 Department of Transportation.
- 7 (d) A temporary speed limit established under this section:
- 8 <u>(1) is a prima facie prudent and reasonable speed</u>
- 9 limit enforceable in the same manner as other prima facie speed
- 10 limits established under other provisions of this subchapter; and
- 11 (2) supersedes any other established speed limit that
- 12 would permit a person to operate a motor vehicle at a higher rate of
- 13 speed.
- 14 (e) A designated official who temporarily lowers a speed
- 15 limit shall:
- 16 (1) place and maintain at the vehicular accident
- 17 reconstruction site temporary speed limit signs that conform to the
- 18 manual and specifications adopted under Section 544.001;
- 19 (2) temporarily conceal all other signs on the highway
- 20 segment affected by the vehicular accident reconstruction site that
- 21 give notice of a speed limit that would permit a person to operate a
- 22 motor vehicle at a higher rate of speed; and
- 23 (3) remove all temporary speed limit signs placed
- 24 under Subdivision (1) and concealments of other signs placed under
- 25 Subdivision (2) when the official finds that the vehicular accident
- 26 reconstruction is complete and all equipment is removed from the
- 27 vehicular accident reconstruction site.

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- 1 (f) A temporary speed limit established under this section
- 2 is effective when a designated official places temporary speed
- 3 limit signs and conceals other signs that would permit a person to
- 4 operate a motor vehicle at a higher rate of speed as required under
- 5 Subsection (e).
- 6 (g) A temporary speed limit established under this section
- 7 <u>is effective until the designated official under Subsection (a) or</u>
- 8 (b):
- 9 (1) finds that the vehicular accident reconstruction
- 10 <u>is complete; and</u>
- 11 (2) removes all temporary signs, concealments, and
- 12 equipment used at the vehicular accident reconstruction site.
- SECTION 3. Section 553.002, Transportation Code, is amended
- 14 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 15 (d) This section does not apply to an ordinance enacted or a
- 16 temporary speed limit sign erected or operated under Section
- 17 5<u>45.3561.</u>
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
