AN ACT 2 relating to the resumption of employment by certain retirees within 3 the Texas Municipal Retirement System.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 852.108, Government Code, is amended by

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6 amending Subsections (c), (e), and (f) and adding Subsection (j) to 7 read as follows:

(c) The retirement system shall discontinue and suspend 8 9 payments of each service retirement annuity that is allowed because 10 of the person's previous service with the reemploying municipality 11 beginning with the month the retirement system determines that the 12 person has again become an employee of the reemploying municipality. After the suspension and except as provided by 13 14 Subsection (j), the retirement system may not make payments of the annuity for any month during which the person remains an employee of 15 16 the reemploying municipality. The suspension of a benefit under this section does not suspend payment of a benefit to an alternate 17 payee under a qualified domestic relations order. 18

(e) After termination of employment with the reemploying municipality and after filing of an application for resumption of retirement with the board of trustees, a person described by Subsection (b) is entitled to receive future payments of the suspended annuity, as provided by Subsection (f), and to the additional benefits as provided by Subsections (g), (h), [and] (i),

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1 <u>and (j)</u>.

2 (f) Monthly payments of a suspended annuity shall be resumed 3 in the month following the month in which employment is terminated with the reemploying municipality, without change in the amount 4 5 except for any increase allowed under Section 854.203 or the duration of or another condition pertaining to the suspended 6 benefit. Except as provided by Subsection (j), payment [Payment] 7 8 of the resumed benefit may not be made for any month during which the payment was suspended under this section. 9

10 <u>(j) A person to whom this section applies shall receive a</u> 11 <u>lump-sum payment in an amount equal to the sum of the service</u> 12 <u>retirement annuity payments the person would have received had the</u> 13 <u>person's annuity payments not been discontinued and suspended under</u> 14 <u>this section if the person:</u>

15 <u>(1) initially retired based on a bona fide termination</u>
16 <u>of employment; and</u>

17 (2) resumed employment with the person's reemploying 18 municipality at least eight years after the effective date of the 19 person's retirement.

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 20 to a member of the Texas Municipal Retirement System who terminates 21 employment with the person's reemploying municipality and files an 22 23 application for resumption of retirement with the board of trustees 24 of the Texas Municipal Retirement System under Section 852.108(e), Government Code, as amended by this Act, on or after the effective 25 26 date of this Act. A member who terminates employment with the person's reemploying municipality and files an application for 27

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1 resumption of retirement with the board under Section 852.108(e),
2 Government Code, before the effective date of this Act is governed
3 by the law as it existed immediately before that date, and the
4 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
