Section 411.135(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 Any person is entitled to obtain from the department: 8 (a) 9 (1)any information described as public information under Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure, [as added by Chapter 10 668, Acts of the 75th Legislature, Regular Session, 1997,] 11 including, to the extent available, a recent photograph of each 12 person subject to registration under that chapter; [and] 13 14 (2) criminal history record information maintained by the department that relates to the conviction of or a grant of 15 deferred adjudication to a person for any criminal offense, 16 including arrest information that relates to the conviction or 17 grant of deferred adjudication; and 18 19 (3) any information described as public information under Section 411.1355(a). 20 SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 411, Government Code, is 21 22 amended by adding Sections 411.1355 and 411.1356 to read as 23 follows:

No. 161 INFORMATION CONCERNING CERTAIN INTOXICATION OFFENSES. 1 (a) 2 Criminal history record information that concerns the conviction of a person within the preceding 10-year period for an offense under 3 Section 49.04, 49.045, 49.07, or 49.08, Penal Code, is public 4 5 information, with the exception of: 6 (1) any information regarding the person's social 7 security number, driver's license number, or telephone number; and 8 (2) any information that would identify the victim of the offense. 9 10 (b) The department shall design and implement an Internet website to allow any person, free of charge, to electronically 11 12 search for and receive information described by Subsection (a) by entering specific search criteria into the website, including a zip 13 code, city, county, or name of a person. The search results must 14 15 include: 16 (1) the last known address of the person convicted; 17 and (2) a recent photograph of the person convicted, if a 18 19 photograph is available to the department. (c) The department shall remove a person's criminal history 20 record information from the Internet website as soon as practicable 21 22 after the earlier of: (1) the 10th annive<u>rsary of the date of the person's</u> 23 24 most recent conviction of an offense listed in Subsection (a); or 25 (2) the date on which the conviction is reversed on 26 appeal, or an order of expunction is entered with respect to records and files in the case. 27

1 Sec. 411.1356. CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION 2 CONCERNING CERTAIN INTOXICATION OFFENSES PROVIDED TO PEACE OFFICER ON REQUEST. The department shall establish a procedure by which a 3 peace officer or employee of a law enforcement agency who provides 4 5 the department with a driver's license number, personal identification certificate number, or license plate number is 6 7 automatically provided information as to whether the department has 8 criminal history record information concerning a conviction within the preceding 10-year period of an offense under Section 49.04, 9 49.045, 49.07, or 49.08, Penal Code, about the person to whom the 10 driver's license, personal identification certificate, or license 11 12 plate is issued. The procedure must allow a peace officer to request the information from the location of a motor vehicle stop and to 13 14 receive a response to the request during the duration of a 15 reasonable motor vehicle stop.

16 SECTION 3. Not later than May 1, 2012, the Department of 17 Public Safety shall make available to a requesting person the 18 information required by Sections 411.1355 and 411.1356, Government 19 Code, as added by this Act.
