- Sec. 60.003. PROOF OF CITIZENSHIP OR AUTHORIZATION TO WORK 19
- REQUIRED. An individual who is licensed to practice or engage in a 20
- 21 particular business, occupation, or profession may engage in that
- work under the license only after the license holder provides to the 22
- 23 licensing authority documentation that the license holder is:

- 7 before March 1, 2012, is governed by the law in effect on the date
- 8 the application was filed, and the former law is continued in effect
- 9 for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
