H.B. No. 227

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to exempting persons who are convicted of certain sexual
- 3 offenses from registering as a sex offender in this state.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Article 42.017, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Art. 42.017. FINDING REGARDING AGE-BASED OFFENSE. In the
- 8 trial of an offense under Section [21.02,] 21.11, 22.011, 22.021,
- 9 or 43.25, Penal Code, the judge shall make an affirmative finding of
- 10 fact and enter the affirmative finding in the judgment in the case
- 11 if the judge determines that:
- 12 (1) at the time of the offense, the defendant was not
- 13 more than four years older than the victim or intended victim
- 14 [younger than 19 years of age] and the victim or intended victim was
- 15 at least 14 $\left[\frac{13}{13}\right]$ years of age; and
- 16 (2) the conviction is based solely on the ages of the
- 17 defendant and the victim or intended victim at the time of the
- 18 offense.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 5(g), Article 42.12, Code of Criminal
- 20 Procedure, is amended to read as follows:
- 21 (g) If a judge places on community supervision under this
- 22 section a defendant charged with an offense under Section 21.11,
- 23 22.011, 22.021, or 43.25, Penal Code, the judge shall make an
- 24 affirmative finding of fact and file a statement of that

- 1 affirmative finding with the papers in the case if the judge
- 2 determines that:
- 3 (1) at the time of the offense, the defendant was not
- 4 more than four years older than the victim or intended victim
- 5 [younger than 19 years of age] and the victim or intended victim was
- 6 at least 14 [13] years of age; and
- 7 (2) the charge to which the plea is entered under this
- 8 section is based solely on the ages of the defendant and the victim
- 9 or intended victim at the time of the offense.
- 10 SECTION 3. Articles 62.301(a), (c), and (d), Code of
- 11 Criminal Procedure, are amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) If eligible under Subsection (b) or (c), a person
- 13 required to register under this chapter may petition the court
- 14 having jurisdiction over the case for an order exempting the person
- 15 from registration under this chapter at any time on or after the
- 16 <u>date of the person's sentencing or [after]</u> the <u>date the</u> person is
- 17 placed on deferred adjudication community supervision, as
- 18 applicable.
- 19 (c) A defendant who before September 1, 2011 [$\frac{2001}{2}$], is
- 20 convicted of or placed on deferred adjudication community
- 21 supervision for an offense under Section 21.11, 22.011, 22.021, or
- 22 43.25, Penal Code, is eligible to petition the court as described by
- 23 Subsection (a). The court may consider the petition only if the
- 24 petition states and the court finds that the defendant would have
- 25 been entitled to the entry of an affirmative finding under Article
- 26 42.017 or Section 5(g), Article 42.12, as appropriate, had the
- 27 conviction or placement on deferred adjudication community

- 1 supervision occurred after September 1, 2011 [2001].
- 2 (d) After a hearing on the petition described by Subsection
- 3 (a), the court may issue an order exempting the person from
- 4 registration under this chapter if it appears by a preponderance of
- 5 the evidence that:
- 6 (1) [as presented by a registered sex offender
- 7 treatment provider, that] the exemption does not threaten public
- 8 safety; [and]
- 9 (2) [that] the person's conduct did not occur without
- 10 the consent of the victim or intended victim as described by Section
- 11 22.011(b), Penal Code;
- 12 (3) the exemption is in the best interest of the victim
- 13 or intended victim; and
- 14 (4) the exemption is in the best interest of justice.
- 15 SECTION 4. Article 62.402, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 Art. 62.402. DETERMINATION OF MINIMUM REQUIRED
- 18 REGISTRATION PERIOD. (a) The department [council] by rule shall
- 19 determine the minimum required registration period under the Adam
- 20 Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006 (42 U.S.C. Section
- 21 16901 et seq.) [14071 (Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children and
- 22 Sexually Violent Offender Registration Program) for each
- 23 reportable conviction or adjudication under this chapter, if this
- 24 state is to receive the maximum amount of federal money available to
- 25 a state as described by that law.
- 26 (b) After determining the minimum required registration
- 27 period for each reportable conviction or adjudication under

- 1 Subsection (a), the <u>department</u> [council] shall compile and publish
- 2 a list of reportable convictions or adjudications for which a
- 3 person must register under this chapter for a period that exceeds
- 4 the minimum required registration period under federal law.
- 5 (c) To the extent possible, the department [council] shall
- 6 periodically verify with the <u>United States Department of Justice's</u>
- 7 Office of Sex Offender Sentencing, Monitoring, Apprehending,
- 8 Registering, and Tracking [Bureau of Justice Assistance] or another
- 9 appropriate federal agency or office the accuracy of the list of
- 10 reportable convictions or adjudications described by Subsection
- 11 (b).
- 12 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act in amending
- 13 Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure, apply to any person who, on
- 14 or after the effective date of this Act, is required to register
- 15 under that chapter, regardless of whether the offense or conduct
- 16 for which the person is required to register occurs before, on, or
- 17 after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 6. Article 42.017 and Section 5(g), Article 42.12,
- 19 Code of Criminal Procedure, as amended by this Act, apply only to a
- 20 judgment of conviction entered on or after the effective date of
- 21 this Act or a grant of deferred adjudication made on or after the
- 22 effective date of this Act.
- 23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
