## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to physical education credits required for high school 3 graduation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, is amended 6 to read as follows:

7 (b-1) The State Board of Education by rule shall require 8 that:

9 (1) except as provided by Subsection (b-2), the 10 curriculum requirements for the recommended and advanced high 11 school programs under Subsection (a) include a requirement that 12 students successfully complete:

13 (A) four credits in each subject of the 14 foundation curriculum under Section 28.002(a)(1), including at 15 least one-half credit in government and at least one-half credit in 16 economics to meet the social studies requirement;

(B) for the recommended high school program, two credits in the same language in a language other than English under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A) and, for the advanced high school program, three credits in the same language in a language other than English under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A); and

(C) for the recommended high school program, <u>five</u>
 and one-half [<del>six</del>] elective credits and, for the advanced high
 school program, <u>four and one-half</u> [<del>five</del>] elective credits;

1 (2) one or more credits offered in the required 2 curriculum for the recommended and advanced high school programs 3 include a research writing component; and

4 (3) the curriculum requirements for the minimum,
5 recommended, and advanced high school programs under Subsection (a)
6 include a requirement that students successfully complete:

7 (A) one credit in fine arts under Section
8 28.002(a)(2)(D); and

9 (B) <u>one and one-half credits</u> [<del>one credit</del>] in 10 physical education under Section 28.002(a)(2)(C).

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
