11	following the end of the school day.
12	(b) The agency shall conduct a study of public and private

14	(1) the number of children served by a public or
15	<pre>private after-school program;</pre>
16	(2) the number and location of children who could
17	benefit from but are not served by an after-school program;

- 2 (c) Not later than December 1, 2012, the agency shall submit

- 7 the study under Subsection (b).
- 8 (d) This section expires December 31, 2012.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
